BACKGROUND

Oil spills remain one of the greatest environmental challenges affecting Nigeria's ecosystems, coastal communities, and national economic stability. With the Niger Delta being a hotspot for oil-related disasters, effective detection, response, and remediation efforts are crucial to safeguarding the country's environmental and socio-economic future.

EVENT CONTEXT

Since its establishment in 2006, NOSDRA has been at the forefront of oil spill management, but emerging trends and increasing spill incidents demand innovative, collaborative, and globally benchmarked solutions.

The Annual Nigeria International Oil Spill Summit & Expo (NIOSS) is envisioned as a premier multi-stakeholder forum, bringing together government leaders, industry experts, research institutions, investors, community leaders, and environmental advocates to foster long-term strategies for oil spill prevention, response, and recovery.

The Nigeria International Oil Spill Summit & Expo (NIOSS 2026) is Africa's premier Presidential-backed summit on oil spill mitigation, modelled after global counterparts like IOSC (USA) and INTERSPILL (Europe). It will convene in 2026 in Port Harcourt, Rivers State, with participation from Governments at all levels, host community leaders, regulators, industry experts, and international partners.
